In 2016, my friend Ashley and I did a church special. We sang "Flawless" by Mercyme – we reached out to people in the church and asked them what their "flaw" is. I remember sitting at the dining room table and writing them all out. I asked Erin what her flaw was and she said "I get my feelings hurt too easy". I remember kinda chuckling at that and thinking "isn't that the truth". On that following Sunday, Ashley and I pinned them on the cross that morning before church and then we watched as people walked in and stared at the cross and then we sang our hearts out. I know we both wanted everyone to feel something – to know that I felt something. After that Sunday – about a week later, I walked into Erin's room and I saw everyone's "flaw" tacked up on her wall. I thought that was the oddest thing. After a few weeks, I made her take them down – against her will. When Josh and I cleaned out Erin's room after she died, I found everyone's flaws tucked away in her underwear drawer. This is something that I've always done and I've told my girls that you always keep the important things in the underwear drawer. I held everyone's flaws in my hands and looked at them and I realized then why it was so important for her to tack their flaws up on her wall. Because she felt understood. And perhaps it was a comfort to her - remembering those flaws up on that cross. I ended up packing everyone's "flaws" in with her other important things in storage – I just couldn't bear to throw them away. The only one I threw away was one of the ones that read "Control". I knew it wasn't needed anymore - I realized that God is the only one ever in Control. I ask you to look at the picture above – if you see a flaw that you are familiar with – just know that God's in control; He holds you in the palm of his hand.
